

# Lockswood Bowling Club Annual Report

## 2016 - 2017

Here is the second Annual Report of the Lockswood Bowling Club. As stated last year, the purpose of the report is twofold, it is intended to be a comprehensive record of the Club activities, and also to serve as a readily accessed Club history.

The November 2016 AGM opened with a minute's silence for the following members who passed away since the last AGM.

There were three items on the agenda.

*The new Constitution (see last year's report) was unanimously agreed.*

*A motion asking the members to agree a set aside sum of money to provide additional changing facilities, was carried by majority.*

*The Election of Officers and Committee was completed without the need for a vote as there was only one nomination for each position and they were duly elected.*

The new President is Ron Collins, with Bob Prince taking the position of Vice President.

The main focus for the newly formed Committee was to provide additional changing room space, hopefully using a log cabin style building, sort out the issues with the new carpet (more later), and our new President was keen to explore the possibility of floodlights around the green.

## **Fixtures and Fittings**

### **Playing Surface**

To put it plainly the new carpet was a huge disappointment to the members, it had less than perfect stitching, unpredictable runs, and played as wide and fast as an indoor rink. In short, it was not fit for purpose. Our Club Secretary, Rob White and Murray Gorman, relentlessly pursued the supplier and finally in late January, our Club Secretary issued a statement informing members that the contractor had agreed to replace the bowling surface at no cost.

On the 26<sup>th</sup> March the new green was ready for use and it was certainly worth the wait. The green plays more like a conventional grass surface in terms of speed and can be relied upon to provide a consistent draw.

To compliment the new carpet, the Club purchased new rubber “egg box” liners for the ditches at the playing ends, these provide cushioning for the bowls, look better aesthetically and are easier to clean, especially in the Autumn when the leaves begin to fall. The Committee are considering purchasing more for the non-playing ends, in 2018.

To assist in green maintenance a new Karcher Sweeper was purchased.

### **White board**


The old white board on the side of the equipment shed had seen better days and was proving difficult to clean, therefore a magnetic replacement was purchased and erected in December.

## Garden Chairs

In April ten more, garden chairs were purchased as the ten bought in 2016 had proved successful, and often considered more comfortable than the garden benches.


## Committee Board

President Ron Collins suggested that for identification purposes, new members and visitors would benefit from a board displaying the current Committee. It was decided that a traditional wooden board should be purchased and Club Member, Dorothy Beaumont, very generously chose to fund it, in return for the pleasure and companionship the Club has afforded her over the years.



## Easy Jacks

Ron Collins also suggested that the Club purchase an item called an Easy Jack. These handy gadgets allow accurate positioning of the Jack without the need to bend. They have been welcomed by some of our members and a surprising number of visiting players.



## Garden Arbours

In January Lockswood very sadly lost a respected and loved member, Colin McKenzie. His wife Sheila wished to fund a memorial to Colin at the Club and it was decided that three Arbours would be purchased and erected around the green. These arbours are enjoyed by the members and visitors to the Club. Not only providing shade and shelter they are aesthetically pleasing and are a fitting memorial to a real Gentleman.



## Changing Rooms (Sherborne Building)

As noted in the introduction one of the ambitions of the Club this year was to provide additional space for changing. To that end a sub committee was formed to see the project through. Various proposals were discussed and eventually it was decided that we should purchase a Log Cabin to be erected to the right of the Conservatory (when viewed from the green).

The Cabin was purchased from Abbey Garden Buildings, the Club employed contractors to complete the groundwork, erect the building and connect the electricity. Volunteer members painted and fitted out the building, which was eventually opened for business in late September.

Very sadly in February, Club member Kay Young passed away, husband and long-standing member Mike and family were very keen to honour Kay's memory and generously agreed to fund the whole changing room project. On September 6<sup>th</sup> Mike and family accompanied by a large number of Club members attended a Dedication Ceremony and Mike unveiled a plaque in memory of Kay.



## **Floodlights**

Unfortunately, the investigation of the provision of floodlights around the playing service was brought an abrupt end. In order for the installation to progress it was necessary to obtain the permission of the Club's leaseholder. Our plans were duly submitted, but the leaseholders felt they were unable to back the proposal. The Committee decided against an appeal.

## **2017 MEMBERSHIP FIGURES**

At the October Executive Meeting, the Membership Secretary, John Beaumont, reported that we have 191 full members, 68 ladies and 123 men. We have a total of 39 social members and 24 Winter Ticket Holders.

At the same time last year, the figures were 182 Full members and 43 Social Members. Winter Ticket Holders last year stood at 13.

Our membership numbers continue to rise and thrive and huge thanks must be extended not only to Membership Secretary John Beaumont, but also to Neil and Maxeen Fletcher who have worked tirelessly, not only to promote the Club and encourage new members, but also to offer coaching and assistance to those members.

In August, instead of our usual Open Day, Neil suggested that the Club have a stand at the very popular Warsash Festival, held in Strawberry Fields, off Newtown Road. The stand was manned by Neil, Maxeen and Derek and Gill Legge. They all did a fantastic job and as a result, 39 people signed up to attend a Fun Day at the Club, with a view to joining.



The Fun Day was a huge success and many of our members turned up to assist the trialists. We had a lot of laughs and signed up some new members as a result.

The Winter Ticket Holder situation has changed, historically most of the WTH's were from Gosport, however at the end of last season they installed their own all-weather surface and as a result in October last year our figures fell from 28 to 13. It is very encouraging that our figures have risen to 24 this year a result of other Clubs using our facilities, including, Fareham, Mayfield and Crofton.

## **Lockswood Gardens**

Our resident gardening magician, Geoff Tocknell has done it again and managed to pull more trophies out of the hat.

Following last year's success in the Fareham in Bloom Competition, Geoff and the team repeated the feat again this year, winning the Gold Medal and the Cup for being outright winners in the Community Gardens category.

Not being one to rest on his laurels (or hydrangeas), Geoff was determined to go one better than last year in the South and South East in Bloom judging. Not exactly a competition, it is run by the RHS and encourages Boroughs, Communities, residents and businesses to improve their environment. Entrants are graded as either, Establishing, Improving, Advancing, Thriving or the top accolade, Outstanding.

Last year Lockwood achieved a "Thriving" at the first attempt. This year Geoff took advice from Matt Wakefield, the Horticultural Development Officer at Fareham Borough Council. Matt suggested improvements, including the provision of bird boxes, more mulching, better composting and also a scrap book of the gardens so that the judges could see it change with seasons.



Bob Prince provided the compost bins, John Windust, the bird boxes, Carol Windust, the scrap book (this resides in the Club and is well worth a look). The mulching was spread by the gardening team who didn't think it was such a good idea!!



Needless to say, all the hard work paid off and Lockwood were duly awarded an "Outstanding".

## **CHARITY WORK**

This year's charities were, The Hampshire and Isle of Wight Air Ambulance (Ladies Captain) and The Alzheimer Society (Club President).
